

How will the LIST team help me?

The LIST team might help you by:

- Talking to your teacher or school staff who know you.
- Coming in to your class.
- Looking at your work.
- Meeting you to talk to you about how you are getting on in school.
- Asking you to come to some group work.
- Sometimes we can help without meeting you in person because we can get the information from staff in school and your parents or carers.

How can I share my views and ideas with LIST?

- You can tell us what you think, how you feel you are doing in school and what you feel you need help with.
- You can write down your ideas or draw how you are feeling.

What is a Locality Inclusion Support Team (LIST)?

The Central LIST is a group of people who do lots of different jobs. We work together with schools to help and support children, young people and their families in the Bedlington, Morpeth, Ashington and Newbiggin areas of Northumberland.



We also help teachers, other staff in schools and families to understand children and how to help them in school and outside of school.

What does the LIST do?

We have lots of different job titles but we all work with children and young people of all ages, from children in nursery and primary school to teenagers at school.



How can I get help from the LIST?

If you are worried about how you are getting on at school you should talk to your parents or your teacher first.

If a teacher thinks that it would be a good idea to get help from the LIST, they will talk with your parents about this and how it should happen.

How does the LIST find out about me?

- Often school staff or your parent or carer will talk to the LIST because they want to help you but are not sure how to do this.
- We will talk to people who know you to find out how you are getting on.
- You have the right to say that you don't want to talk to us, if you would rather not.
- You can ask questions about us and about how we might help.
