

How can I get help from the team?

If you have concerns about your child or feel your family need help from the Central LIST, please contact your school first. If support is required, beyond what is available in school, then a request for support will be made to LIST.



LIST colleagues meet regularly to discuss new requests from schools and arrange who will take the lead in providing help.

How is it decided who helps?

LIST members, along with colleagues from schools, discuss each request carefully. If it is an appropriate request, a decision is made as to which professionals will become involved.

What is a Locality Inclusion Support Team (LIST)?

The Central LIST is a group of people from a range of professional backgrounds who work together with schools, Children's Centres and the community to give early and targeted support for children, young people and their families in the Morpeth, Bedlington and Ashington areas of Northumberland.

What are the aims of the team?

The Central LIST aims to provide support for children, young people, schools and their families that is:

- Early/Timely
- Preventative
- Targeted
- Specialised
- Focused
- Monitored
- Reviewed



Who is in the team?

The following professionals:

- Education Welfare Officers
- Inclusion Support Workers
- Specialist Teacher Autistic Spectrum
- Educational Psychologists
- Behaviour Support Workers
- Behaviour Support Teachers
- Specialist Literacy Teacher
- Specialist Literacy Assistant
- Specialist Language Teacher/Speech and Language Therapist
- Traveller Education Family Liaison Officer
- Specialist Language Assistants
- Bereavement/Loss Counsellor
- Administrative Officers

How does the team receive requests for support?

Schools and Children's Centres make requests for LIST support for individual pupils, groups of pupils or for whole school issues.

There is also a LIST Area Strategy Group which looks at projects to support Early Intervention and Prevention across Central Northumberland.

What kind of support can the team offer?

There are a lot of different ways that the Central LIST might help as each professional in the team has specialist skills, knowledge and experience.

The types of support offered by the Central LIST might include:

- Meetings in school with Parents/Carers and school staff
- Targeted individual support and advice for children and young people
- Group work around a particular theme or issue
- Groups for Parents/Carers
- Training for school staff in identified areas
